Diocesan News Update 26 June 2018

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Connecting with Anglican Family Care - Mannaki Whānau

Recently the Diocesan Registrar met some of the Dunedin based family care team. Nicola Taylor reports...

We were very pleased to have the opportunity to meet with Andrew Metcalfe, Diocesan Registrar. His position is an important one for us at Anglican Family Care Centre as we manage the multitude of interfaces and overlaps between the work of the agency and the Diocese in every aspect of their activity. Our senior manager team introduced themselves to Andrew:

Nola Waller, Board Secretary, Executive Assistant with responsibilities for Human Resource work, is the liaison point between the AFC Board and the Diocese. Our Board (appointed by Diocesan Council) meets the fourth Thursday of the month, 12.30, at 266 Hanover Street. The Bishop is an 'ex officio' member of our Board. Our Board has in recent years had meetings with Diocesan Council, usually twice a year. This has been disrupted for this year while we have pursued discussions with Catholic Social Services about working more closely together. We are continuing to look at how we can do this going forward but do appreciate that this has absorbed time and energy particularly from our Bishop. We would like to thank the Bishop and those within the Diocese who have given so generously of their support and wise advice during recent months.

Lucy Summers, Manager for Fundraising, Marketing and Communications, works closely with the Diocesan Office in the distribution of our newsletters. We also attend various events by invitation, meeting with groups, speaking in the context of church services, and attending assemblies at St Hilda's. Please get in touch if you would like the opportunity to meet with us.

Kathy Richards, Practice Manager, has oversight of the diverse range of services we offer, with staff based in Dunedin, South Otago, North Otago, Central Otago and Queenstown Lakes. This includes Restorative Justice, Family Start, Home Based Social Work, counselling, play therapy, Oceans, respite care and referrals directly from Oranga Tamariki.

Mike Williams has been appointed Business Support Manager, to replace Craig Ashton who has moved on. He begins work on 2 July. His connection with the Diocese will focus mainly on all things administrative and financial, particularly investments we hold with Dunedin Diocese Trust Board.

We all in different ways connect with parishes. The Friends of AFC (Anglican Family Care) protocol is active in South, North and Central Otago, as well as in Wanaka and Queenstown. Our Team Leaders are developing close relationships with the parishes who offer amazing support to our work. We are always willing to speak in churches or attend any event by invitation. We do attend Parish Life at St Paul's which is a great way to be connected.

We prepare an annual report to Synod and at times we have had the opportunity to speak to this.

We do convene regular meetings of CHAG (Christian Helping Agencies Group) in Dunedin – a network of Directors of Catholic Social Services, St Vincent de Paul, Methodist Mission, Family Works and Salvation Army.

I have until recently been Diocesan rep on Anglican Care Network, now replaced by Liz Liddell (who is also on the Social Transformation Committee). This is an important national forum for Anglican social services throughout New Zealand. The network is fund holder for the Tindall funding, which is distributed once a year.

We look forward to working closely with Andrew and the Diocese, as we have many strengths to share in a challenging and ever-changing environment.

CWS appeals for Refugees on World Refugee Day

The growing number of refugees is deeply worrying and an indication of the urgent need for global action according to Christian World Service. CWS is appealing for greater support to fund local relief for some of the most pressing humanitarian situations, and more action to address the drivers of displacement.

"The level of humanitarian need is unprecedented and widely acknowledged. It has not resulted in the necessary action – either to stop the conflicts from which people are fleeing or provide for the immediate safety and care of those displaced. More help is urgent," says Pauline McKay, National Director.

This Sunday Methodist and Presbyterian Churches mark Refugee Sunday, which will be celebrated on July 1 in the Anglican tradition. CWS has produced [worship resources](#) for churches. Churches are encouraged to organise an offering for displaced people from [Syria](#), [South Sudan](#), [Rohingya](#), or [Gaza](#).

The United Nations Refugee Agency (UNHCR) [reports](#) 68.5 million people had fled their homes in 2017, up from 65.6 million in 2016.

A record 25.4 million people registered as refugees in 2017. 85% [found](#) shelter in developing countries where they often struggle to meet their daily needs with very limited support from the global community. The UNHCR appeal to assist the largest population of refugees from Syria (6.3 million) is only 17% funded this year. 40 million more are displaced within their own country.

New Zealand churches have helped to resettle refugees and funded relief efforts for more than seventy years. Caring for the refugee is an important responsibility in the Christian faith. CWS has been a strong supporter of initiatives to increase the quota of refugees resettled in New Zealand.

Last year the quota was increased from 750 to 1,000, and the current government [plans](#) to increase it to 1,500.

The [Global Compact on Refugees](#) and the [Global Compact for Safe, Orderly and Regular Migration](#) are currently under negotiation under the auspices of the United Nations.

CWS is grateful to participants in this year's [Operation Refugee](#) raising funds to help Syrian refugees with food, education and medical care. Most complete the challenge to live on refugee rations today. However, people are welcome to join the challenge or support participants until the end of July.

Strengthening New Zealand's heritage protection

Although at times these can seem to be more of a burden than a blessing and some hard decisions have had to be made over the years, they are part of our taonga, treasures that are an important part of who we are.

The Ministry for Culture and Heritage, with the support of the Minister for Arts, Culture and Heritage Rt Hon Jacinda Ardern (on parental leave!), is undertaking an assessment of New Zealand's system for protecting heritage buildings.

Many in our Diocese are passionate about caring for our resources, and there is an opportunity for you to have a voice in the future protection of our heritage.

There is concern that preventable and irreversible loss of heritage buildings is occurring in New Zealand. Your views are sought on how heritage buildings are recognised and protected, and how our protection system may be improved. This may have a long term impact on heritage protection and is a real opportunity for you to have a say.

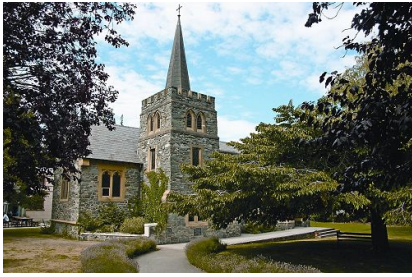

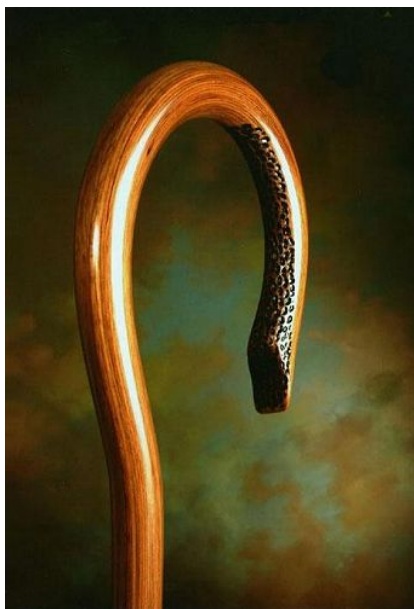

Fund Our Bishop Update June 2018

In 2016 a “Fund Our Bishop” campaign began to help ensure our Diocese could continue to support having a Bishop in post

At this time, 67 donors signed up and contributed just over \$18k in the first year. By 2017, the number of donors had fallen to 55, but the amount received was \$32k, helped along by a very generous one-off donation of \$12k. We are continuing to receive around \$18k per year, with other donors generously continuing to support other funds such as the Diocesan Foundation and the Bishopric Endowment.

The budgeted income we have in place to support our Bishop is \$127K per year. It is made up of about \$57K from Bishopric Endowment fund interest, \$50K from the St Johns Trust (which we have been successful in gaining for the past two years, but which may not continue in the future) and around \$20k from the Fund Our Bishop campaign

plus other income.

In terms of the expenditure around a Bishop, this runs at \$151k per year. It includes the Bishops salary and pension, secretarial costs car and other travel as well as other associated expenses. **This leaves a shortfall of \$24k** met from general Diocesan funds.

When the Fund Our Bishop campaign was originally set up, it was on the basis that it gave us some time to get our house more in order i.e. we were looking at doing this for a 5 year time period. We need to talk more about this in the future, but we do know that contributing to the Bishopric Endowment fund is the best way to support having a Bishop in the long term.

Diocesan Website Improvements

Some of you may be aware that the Diocesan Website has been having difficulties

The website developers are currently working on a solution so that we can get things up and running again. It does mean that we have not been able to update forms for a while and links to other parish websites have disappeared.

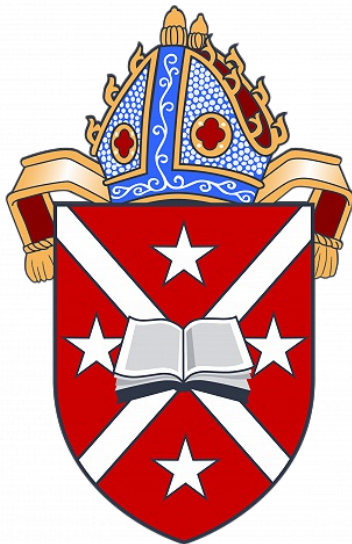

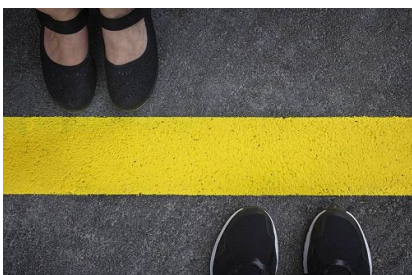

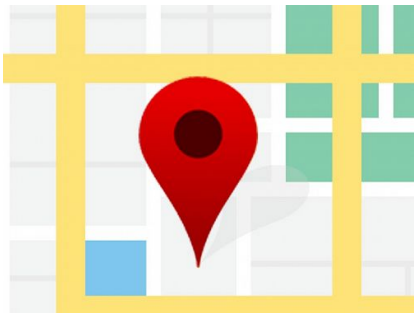
