Principal's Message:

Aloha, Tēnā koutou katoa e te whānau and warm Pacific greetings!

At the moment I am sending you much Aloha from the beautiful island of Hawaii where I have been lucky enough to attend the 13th Festival of Pacific Arts and Culture - FesPAC. It is a revival of traditions old and new. The festival takes place every four years rotating locations throughout the Pacific Ocean between Micronesia, Melanesia and Polynesia. The opening ceremony consisted of 27 nations who all showcased their beautiful cultures, dance and costumes. It was truly an amazing experience. It is an opportunity to show the true spirit of aloha as we build connections between Pacific nations and share cultural practices and indigenous knowledge. The key pillars of the festival include: Ceremonies and Protocols, Performing Arts, Visual Arts and Heritage Arts.

Our recent Teacher Only Day which was organised by the Kāhui Ako also reiterated the importance of culture, identity, language and faith. Our staff were able to hear 3 very experienced keynote speakers who highlighted the need to connect with our children and families and value the experiences our children bring to school. We have 4 staff who hold key positions in our Kāhui and they lead sessions on bi-cultural education and best practice in teaching and learning. We are so lucky to have these very experienced and talented members on staff sharing their knowledge with other schools in Ōtāhuhu.

At the end of this week we will be hosting a number of schools in South Auckland for the year 5 / 6 Samoan speech competition as well as the year 7 / 8 competition on Friday. We wish our tamaiti all the best as they compete against other schools.
