RECTOR'S MESSAGE



It's all 'on' again! The gates are open. Lessons are well underway. Friendships and acquaintances are renewed. And our wider co-curricular activity is gathering steam. We welcome boys and families new to Timaru Boys' and those of you returning for another year. The full vitality and diversity of TBHS is back.

It was a delight to bring new boys and staff into the school and community, at our Powhiri on 7 February. Included in our 44 teaching staff are newly arrived: **Sonia Everitt** and **Tim Clack** (Mathematics), **Karen Staples** (English), **Debbie Newman** (Digital Technology), **Hamish Cameron** (Commerce), and **Monique Bastings** (Music). Tim and Karen return having taught here as 'relievers' last year.

Our newly appointed Head Boy is **Brad Cvitanich**. He will be well supported by Deputy Head Boys **Hamish Dunbar** and **Tim Currie**, and Head of House, **Ollie Browning**. We know these four young men will serve their peers, staff, community, and our wider school interests, to the best of their ability. They are also part of a promising group of nineteen prefects selected for 2017.

We have received our 2016 NZQA results. The increase in NCEA Level 2 and Level 3 Certificate achievement was pleasing and a huge credit to the boys and staff who worked hard to generate them. The school sits above all of the 'national', 'national male', and 'decile', roll - based benchmarks for Levels 1, 2 and 3.

It was also tremendous to see the rise in Excellence Endorsements on Certificates at all Levels; a fantastic NCEA accolade for these boys and their teachers and parents. 2016 Endorsed boys were recognised at an Academic Assembly on 8 February. From NZQA Scholarship examinations we congratulate **Ryan Davis** for being awarded Scholarships in Chemistry and Physics, and **Liam Arthur** for Scholarships in Chemistry, Biology, English and Economics. This placed them both in the top 3% in New Zealand. We look forward to working with our Seniors to extend these positive NCEA and Scholarship performances.

The 2017 House Competition has launched with the Swimming Sports and Athletics Day. The five records broken in the pool by **Jack Sands**, **Hercules Cho** and **Riley Taylor**, and personal bests achieved at the stadium, put new year sport on an exciting early footing. These events showed the first influence of the vertical house group system we added this year; with sets of Year 9 - 13 boys joining for House - based interaction each morning before period 1. As these new groups develop, they will be a place for imparting POWER values and extra House spirit.

Last week we hosted ERO reviewers **Russell Wallace**, **Chris Gold**, and **Liz Riley** as they collected information from the boys, staff, and Board about growth and achievement at TBHS in the past, present and future. We expect their report to be available near the end of term.

If you get a moment, stop by to see the beautiful new sculpture 'Knowledge, Power, Wisdom and Family' located on the library lawn off North Street. It was kindly gifted by the 2016 Year 13 students. Sculpted by Debbie Templeton - Page, it will be enjoyed for years to come. Perhaps it will inspire the 200-300 boys we anticipate signing on for Arts Week later this year. Across from the sculpture the renovation of the Sick Bay and Gillies entrance is progressing well and options for its opening later this term are being considered; more to follow.

Finally, we have Open Day on Sunday 19 March 1-3pm. Come along to check in with us and friends here again, and please encourage others new to TBHS to pop in to learn about 'who we are and what we do' as well.

Experience of a Lifetime!

I was extremely fortunate to have been selected to represent Timaru Boys' High School at a unique seminar held in Israel during the month of January. The latter was sponsored by the Holocaust Museum in Wellington, Yad Vashem Holocaust International School for Holocaust Studies in Jerusalem and the Israeli Ministry of Foreign Affairs. Educators from all over New Zealand were participants in this special venture.

We experienced 115 hours of lectures by experts in the field of Ancient Jewish History, Anti-Semitism and the Holocaust as experienced through the mediums of Art, Literature, Music and Film. Our weekend excursions were designed to complement the academic presentations at Yad Vashem. For example, we visited the British War Cemetery on Mount Scopus where a significant number of New Zealand soldiers are honoured. The Israel Museum was also a revelation as it contained only artefacts concerning the history of Israel including the Dead Sea Scrolls. On one of our excursions we visited Qumran and the caves where the scrolls were actually discovered. Bethlehem was a special highlight of our trip and is the location of many magnificent churches such as the Church of the Holy Sepulchre that is decorated with eye catching icons and paintings.

During our weekend excursions we also experienced a boat trip on the Sea of Galilee; as we embarked the crew played the New Zealand anthem in both Maori and English! Mount Zion was also a fascinating area to visit being the traditional site of the Last Supper. In Jaffa we explored the Independence Hall where David Ben Gurion proclaimed the Independent State of Israel on 14th May 1948. One of the most intriguing places we visited in the Old City of Jerusalem were the Western Wall Tunnels situated beneath the streets of Jerusalem These were tiny caves where you

could appreciate the different levels of civilisation dating back to the Roman Period. We visited and bathed in the Dead Sea which is known for its medicinal properties. The Second Temple fortress of Masada was of particular interest as it was built by King Herod in the Judean Desert in the $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$ Century BCE.

From a teaching perspective, I feel we all benefitted greatly from the presentations and interviews conducted with survivors of the Holocaust. To share their stories which constitute primary sources in History was definitely a unique experience. Following our visit to Oskar Schindler's grave we were very privileged to meet one of the survivors of the Holocaust who was on Schindler's list, a story that has been immortalised by Steven Spielberg in his Oscar winning movie (seven Oscars to be exact). I am very much looking forward to sharing my experiences and the new resources I have obtained with both my Senior and Junior classes this year.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank our Rector Nick McIvor, our supportive staff at Timaru Boys' High School and Alpine Energy for making my participation in this life changing visit to Israel a reality!

Athletes battle hot conditions at Athletics Meeting

Extremely hot conditions confronted students at the Timaru Boys' High School Athletics day. This took its toll on the students but they battled through with some impressive performances.

Quinn Motley was the stand out in the Minor grade with wins in the 400m, Discus, Javelin and the Shotput. The rest of the event was spread amongst a number of students with no one taking more than one win.

In the junior grade, *William Rawlins* was to the fore taking out the sprint trifecta with wins in the 100, 200 and 400m races as well as the High Jump and the Javelin. His brother Peter took out the longer events with victories in the 800, 1500 and 3000ms.

Ben Sewell took out the 100ms in the Intermediate section as well as wins in the 100m hurdles, High Jump, Long Jump and the Triple Jump. **George Guerin** proved he is in good form with

Bailey Gebbie was the king of the long distance events in the Seniors with wins in the 400m, 800m and the 1500m as well as taking out the Triple Jump. Hayden McNulty won the 200m and the Javelin. Tevita Eukiliti won the Senior 100m in a time of 11.9 seconds, following this up with a victory in the Champion of Champions race which pits the top sprinters of all age groups against one another. He took this out in a time of 11.4 seconds, an improvement on his Senior time. A good number of athletes have put themselves in contention for the Aoraki and South Island events later this season.

Tennis came to the party and stopped the clean sweep in the summer interschool between Timaru Boys' High School and Otago Boys' held in Timaru. Timaru had a comprehensive victory against a weakened Otago Boys' team, beating them by twelve games to nil in both singles and doubles. Timaru were themselves weakened with number one player *James Watt* out with a broken wrist. *Josh Cameron* stepped up to the number one spot with a 6-0, 6-0 victory in the singles. *Aidan Watt* and *Shaun Reith* also performed well in their first school Exchange.

The **Golfers** struggled against some quality opposition losing 4-0. *William Warahi* the standout, especially with a 2 on the par four opening hole at Highfield Golf Course.

The **Touch** team found the opposition too hot to handle with Otago taking a clean sweep winning three games to nil with Otago winning 5-1, 4-0 and 9-2 in the final game. *Joel Hill* and *Jimmy Robertson* ran the team well on attack while *Ryan Greenslade* was another to stand out.

The 1st XI Cricket team found the going tough against Otago Boys' but produced a bit more stubbornness than teams in the last couple of years. Otago batted first in the 50 over game, scoring 314 for 9, with the runs shared amongst the top order. *Charlie Martin* was expensive but took some crucial wickets with 4-62 while *Shaun Rooney* took 2-54.

Timaru Boys' started brightly with Otago being quite loose with their bowling conceding a number of extras. They eventually tightened up with wickets falling at regular intervals. TBHS fought their way through to 135 in the 40th over. Newcomer to the team *Hayden McNulty* scored 40 not out with *Charlie Martin* completing a good match with 20 runs to go with his 4 wickets. *William Sharp* also contributed with twenty runs.

The **TBHS Colts Cricket** team also fought well but ultimately come up short against their Otago opposites. Otago batted first scoring 199 for 3. *Jacob Cumming* top scored with 104 not out. This is a familiar name to Timaru Boys as his dad Craig was a prolific cricketer in his time at Timaru Boys and beyond. Timaru responded with 124 for 7. *Hugh Cameron* hit the ball for a well compiled 31 and *Alex Doyle* contributed with a good knock of 25. A win to Otago Boys by 4-1.

Swimming Sports

Last week's annual Swimming Sports produced some outstanding results from our top swimmers.

Riley Taylor recorded an exceptional 17min 5 seconds in the 1500m, beating the 26 year old record set by Robbie Hill in 1991. On top of this, he just missed breaking the senior 50m freestyle record by .1s – we look forward to watching Riley's progress in 2018!

Standout swimmer *Jack Sands* took out three titles – the 50m backstroke (30.8s), breaststroke (34s) and the 100m freestyle in 57.8s – as well as winning the senior championship title.

Hercules Cho who has represented Hong Kong at International level also produced an excellent result in the 50m butterfly, coming in at 29.3sec.

The 2018 swimming sports are a highly anticipated event – we look forward to seeing what results our young swimmers will be able to produce in another year!



It didn't take long to realise we were in the middle of a huge earthquake which kept on going for ever and of course we live in Hawkes Bay which is a long way from the epicentre in Kaikoura. As if that wasn't quite enough, we all became aware of the Port Hills fires on Monday 13 February and the similar fires at Waimarama in Hawkes Bay the same week.

It is probable that various Old Boys were caught up in these terrible events and we can only hope that everyone came through unscathed.

In the meantime we held a joint Old Boys'/Old Girls' function at the Havelock North Club on 23'November and although around 35 people turned up, we could have coped with more. One extra Old Boy who turned up at the last minute was Stuart North, along with his wife Adair. Stuart is the Old Boys' convenor for Auckland and he gave us a very informative and amusing address. We are still a bit puzzled as to why more Old Boys do not come to these gatherings and we will be holding a local meeting soon to discuss ways and means of doing it better. It seems that it is a nationwide problem and to that end, there have been informal discussions as to how we can convince more Old Boys to become involved and also to become members.

At the National executive level we are in the process of setting up a modified structure with a business plan to support it in the future. It will involve setting up sub-committees with a minimum of two people on each one to maintain continuity, such as membership, marketing, website, branches, archives etc. So we are looking for volunteers, particularly South Canterbury domiciled Old Boys who are prepared to donate some of their time.
