



FUNDRAISING IDEAS

Here are some ideas you can use to raise money and awareness for an Anglican Missions project. Make sure to let people know what project you're fundraising for! If you need up to date information or photos about a project, get in touch with us through our website or info@anglicanmissions.org.nz.



1. RUN AN AUCTION

An auction is a fun and engaging way to bring people together. Try a silent auction during the day, or a live auction at night. Pop a notice in your church newsletter and ask local businesses to donate goods or experiences to be auctioned off. You could also ask people to auction their time if they have useful skills such as gardening or cooking.



2. HOST A QUIZ NIGHT

Host a quiz night at your local pub/restaurant, or in your church hall and charge koha entry. If you can convince your host pub/restaurant to donate some of their profits from food and drinks from the event to the project, then that's a bonus! Cover a few different categories and ask local businesses to donate prizes for the winners!



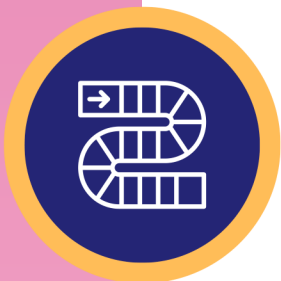
3. ORGANISE A RAFFLE

Contact local businesses to donate items or experiences to be raffled off. Sell raffle tickets at church and to your friends and family. You could also do a raffle in the lead up to a fundraiser (such as a quiz night) and draw the winners of a big prize on the night!



4. PRESENT A MOVIE NIGHT

You could book a local cinema (who often give discounts for fundraisers) or use your church projector and set up your church to look like a movie theatre (think cushions, blankets and fairy lights). Charge a koha entry and koha drinks and popcorn. Screen movies that have thematic ties to your project - ie. "A Life On Our Planet" for environmentally focussed projects.



5. CURATE A GAMES NIGHT

Have a range of different board games that people can move around when they finish one game. Have a couple of TVs and game consoles with group video games available (like Rockband, FIFA Soccer or Wii Sports). Invite families, youth and children for a koha entry. This is a simple yet effective fundraiser to organise.



6. COMMUNITY INVOLVED EVENTS

Open mic nights are a great way to involve lots of people - find a venue (like your church hall) and scout out local talent in your area! You could also host a bake sale with people contributing their baked goodies for purchase. And, to burn off those calories, you could organise a biking, walking or running challenge where sponsors can donate per kilometre!
