How does the programme work?

Careerforce Apprenticeships are 120-credit programmes designed to be delivered in the workplace supported by online learning and assessments. The underpinning philosophy of the programme is to build a person-centred workforce that ensures people living in New Zealand have supports that are tailored to their individual needs and goals and that take a whole of life approach.

The programme leads to the achievement of the NZ Certificate in Health and Wellbeing (Social and Community Services) Level 4, a NZQA recognised qualification. You are able to choose a strand or specialisation in:

- Community Facilitation
- Community Health Work
- Diversional Therapy
- Mental Health & Addiction Support
- Social Services

Delivered via an apprenticeship model, 'apprentices' will have a dedicated Careerforce Advisor who acts as a coach and assessor. These Advisors are located throughout the country and can support apprentices regardless of location.

TTAF

Through the Targeted Training and Apprenticeships Fund (TTAF), the usual \$2,000 enrolment fee is waived for enrolments through to December 2022.

Apprenticeship Boost

Employers may be eligible to claim Apprenticeship Boost payments of \$1000/mth for first year apprentices, and \$500/mth for second year apprentices as they complete their programme.
