Ko te pae tawhiti, whāia kia tata; ko te pae tata, whakamaua kia tīna. - Seek out distant horizons and cherish those you attain.



TE TIRITI O WAITANGI

YSAR acts as kaitiaki over the taonga of New Zealand. We wish to teach our rangitahi how they should be looking after and interacting with our awa and whenua. We aim to integrate both western science and matauranga Maori principles in their understanding of nature and conservation. Principles of manaakitanga, tapu, mana, taonga, and mauri integrated into our curriculum and instilled into our youth, so they can demonstrate and share these principles.



WHAT WE DO



We deliver a **three year training programme** to students at secondary school level that is shaped by SAR, the EM sector, Coastguard, LandSAR and others. Students learn in classrooms, on-site with sector agencies, and in the outdoors through an authentic and blended-learning approach.


