Te Kura o Paeraki – Mt Pleasant School has emergency management procedures in place that allow us to prepare for and respond to fire, gas, and chemical-related emergencies, and situations requiring evacuation and reverse evacuation. We are guided in the development and implementation of our policies by legislation and the advice of relevant agencies.

Printed emergency plans and procedures
