About Our School



History

Southwell School (Southwell) is the product of one man's vision - Mr Cecil Ernst Ferris - who immigrated from Southwell, England to New Zealand. In settling in the Waikato region, Ferris discovered there was a need - and an opportunity - to provide boys with a "fuller" educational experience than that which was offered by traditional country schools at the time.


In late 1911, Ferris started the school with one boy, and overtime, grew the roll and expanded the campus. In 971, MR H G Sergel was appointed Headmaster and consequently relocated the school to where it rests today, in the heart of Hamilton.

For a period, the school was privately owned by Sergel's family and in 1963, Southwell was gifted to become a not-for-profit Education Institution managed by a Trust Board, which remains in place today.

In 2000, Southwell became co-educational and the school roll is now 50:50 gender balance.

Southwell is founded in the Anglican faith and continues to provide Anglican-based religious education to all students. However, the school has long been accepting students from all religious backgrounds and the current school roll reflect this.

Inspiring Worship:

• The Chaplain conducts services for students and staff on most school days. At Chapel Services, the Chaplain inspires and challenges students with stories from many faith traditions. Prayers for wisdom, compassion, healing, and comfort are offered, and separate Girls' and Boys' Chapel Choirs lead the worship.


Pastoral Care & Support:

Chapel Services:


• Lead daily morning chapel services, creating a welcoming and respectful environment for worship and prayer. Organise and conduct occasional Sunday services.
