		During the event: children must ask the coach for permission to go to the toilet. The child needs to report back to the coach.	
		Hagley/Nunweek toilets are checked by the coach before they are used. Children must go to the toilet in pairs	
		A final roll call takes place before boarding the bus to return to school.	
		If a child does go missing the MISSING CHILD response plan is actioned by the teacher in charge. The school is immediately notified.	
		The office is provided a list of students who are attending the event.

		The coaches are responsible for monitoring children's behaviour, location and safety.

Physical Fitness		Children participating in the event have qualified to compete as they have demonstrated the ability to play the game safely and to a high standard.	
Head Injury	Significant	A light knock to the head or neck - First aid is provided by the coach or first aider.  A concussion assessment will be completed and the child will be monitored by the coach.  Coaches will record the incident in a First-Aid book at school. The office staff will inform parents by telephone.  Serious knock to the head or neck - Observations have identified that a concussion may have occurred. The office will phone parents. Coach to record incidents in First-Aid Book on return.  Severe Knock to the head or neck - There are obvious signs that the child has a concussion and immediate medical assistance is required. Teachers-in-charge will phone an Ambulance and the office will be informed. The Office will phone the parents. The Principal will meet the student at the Accident and Emergency Centre. Medical  Asthma and allergies	Moderate	All asthmatics have their inhalers with them or in a place close to the course. This is verified by the event leader before children leave the school.  The event leader checks if any children in the team are allergic and needing an epi-pen. The event leader ensures that coaches are aware of students medical conditions and are given appropriate medication like epi pens to carry so they can be used immediately is required. SERIOUS INJURY	Significant	If a serious injury happens while competing, the coach administers first aid while:  • Emergency services are called.  • The child is transported to hospital  • The coach immediately calls the school  • The office will call the parents.  • The principal will go to the hospital and meet the ambulance and parents there.  • The coach stays with the team. CIVIL EMERGENCY	Significant	If a civil emergency strikes while competing, the children will stop, take appropriate action to keep themselves safe and then report to their coach.  If children have been injured, they are moved to a safe place, coaches provide first aid and the emergency services are called.  The coaches follow the instructions of the event organiser.  If the event needs to be cancelled and it is safe to travel, the team returns to the bus pick up area and will return to school.  If the bus has not arrived yet, the coaches will contact the school who will arrange for earlier pick-up.  If the bus company cannot provide earlier transport, the school will organise alternative transport. Transport children from Hagley/Nunweek park back to school.  If the team is unable to return to school they will relocate to the following venues: Hagley Park is to move to the netball centre. For Nunweek Hockey courts, if unsafe, move to the open grass area of Nunweek Park.
