Year 7

Year 7 offers a wide range of subjects covering academic, practical, and cultural education.

Year 8

Year 8 offers a wide range of subjects, giving students a chance to discover and develop their skills and interests in academic, cultural, artistic, and practical areas.

Students will study the following subjects:

- Literacy (Reading / Writing)
- · Mathematics and Statistics
- Science
- Social Sciences
- · Health and Physical Education
- · Te Reo Māori (the Māori language)
- Music
- · Performing Arts
- · Visual Art
- · Digital Technology

Additional Support: Students who require extra support with English Language Learning (ELL) may be placed in specialised classes designed to assist them in acquiring English proficiency while still covering the core subject.

Year 9

All students in Year 9 take English, Mathematics and Statistics, Science, Social Sciences, Health and Physical Education, Digital Technology and Ara Māori. It is recommended that students have a balanced course in Year 9 by selecting options from each of the remaining Essential Learning Areas:

- Te Reo Māori
- Spanish
- Japanese

Technology (Half Year Options)

- Technology Hard Materials
- Textiles Technology
- Food and Nutrition
- Design and Visual Communication
- Robotics

The Arts (Half Year Options)

English Language Learning (for students who do not have English as a first language)

Selection Guidelines:

Students typically choose three or four option subjects, depending on whether they are full year or half year courses. Full year option subjects include all Language subjects (note that taking a language at Year 9 is generally essential for continuing in the study of that language at Year 10 and beyond). Half year option subjects are available in a range of Learning Areas.

Considerations:

It is important for students to look ahead to the Year 10 course outlines for entry requirements or recommendations related to subject areas that might interest them in the future. The variety of subjects offered ensures students can tailor their Year 9 studies to their interests and potential career pathways, but it is a good idea to keep a range of pathways open at this early stage of high school education. Students can talk to the Careers Advisor (Mr Nixon) for advice on subjects that are suited to career pathways.



Year 10

All students in Year 10 take English, Mathematics and Statistics, Science, Social Sciences, and Health and Physical Education. It is recommended that students begin to identify and focus on their areas of strength and interest when they select Year 10 subjects, while also keeping their options open for future years.

Selection Guidelines:

Students choose two to four option subjects, depending on whether they are full year or half year courses. They are encouraged to commit to full year courses for their top choice(s).

Considerations: It is important for students to look ahead to the Year 11 course outlines for entry requirements or recommendations related to subject areas that might interest them in the future. The variety of subjects offered ensures students can tailor their Year 10 studies to their interests and potential career pathways. It is a good idea to keep a range of pathways open but also to consider the benefit of full-year courses for subjects they are likely to select for their future NCEA studies. Students can talk to the Careers Advisor (Mr Nixon) for advice on subjects that are suited to particular career pathways.



Senior School Curriculum

Year 11

There are three compulsory courses in Year 11, and three optional courses.

Compulsory Courses

English

Mathematics and Statistics

Science (External or Internal Science)

Optional Courses

Students select three additional subjects beyond the compulsory ones. Students typically select courses that focus on the National Certificate in Educational Achievement (NCEA) Level One. Courses that are at NCEA Level One can be identified by the course codes, e.g. 1TEN, 1DRA, 1SST, etc.

Attaining NCEA Level One

To achieve NCEA Level One, a student needs to earn a minimum of 60 credits at the Achieved level or higher. Students must also earn the Achieved level in Literacy

(Reading and Writing) and Numeracy in the Common
Assessment Activities or other approved standards.
Credits can be earned from both Unit Standards (only
Achieved level) and Achievement Standards (three levels:
Achieved, Achieved with Merit, Achieved with Excellence). A
'Not Achieved' grade means that students are not awarded
those credits.

Assessment Methods in NCEA:

Internal Assessment: Conducted within the school; includes assignments, projects, and other forms of assessment. External Assessment: Typically involves examinations in November for most subjects. Some subjects may also have external assessment through submission of a portfolio of work.

Year 12

Students in Year 12 at Hillmorton High School must take an English course (except by special arrangement with their Manutaki/Dean). Students can then choose to take four or five optional courses.

Most students will study subjects appropriate to NCEA Level Two. These courses can be identified by the course code, e.g. 2BIO, 2MAE, 2PED, etc.

Students who have achieved NCEA Level One in Year 11 are entered for the NCEA Level Two qualification. To gain NCEA Level Two, students must gain 80 credits at the Achieved level or above. 60 of these credits must be at Level Two or above. Students must also have achieved the Level 1 Literacy and Numeracy co-requisites.

20 credits can come from NCEA Level One. Credits can be attained via internal assessment or external assessment. External assessments usually occur in November; however, some subjects may submit portfolios of work for external marking.

Students who have not achieved NCEA Level One yet, may need to take a combination of NCEA Level One and NCEA Level Two subjects. Students in this situation should contact their Manutaki (Dean) and the Careers Advisor to help determine the best course options for them.

When selecting their subjects, it is recommended that students check the requirements of the courses they intend to take in NCEA Level Three in Year 13. Most students enter NCEA Level Three, so it is essential that Year 12 students who intend to do so consider their own pathway and the subjects they require.

Dual Enrolment

Dual Enrolment is an opportunity available to some Year 12 students. It involves attending a course at a tertiary provider (usually Ara/ Te Pūkenga) for one or two days each week throughout the year, and attending Hillmorton High School for the other three/four days. See the Dual Enrolment section of this Course Book for more information.



Year 13

Students in Year 13 at Hillmorton High School are expected to study five subjects. Most students will study subjects appropriate to NCEA Level Three. These courses can be identified by the course code, e.g. 3PHY, 3MAC, 3ART, etc. Students intending to go to university must ensure the courses they choose provide them opportunities to gain University Entrance. Furthermore, students must check the prerequisite requirements for specialist Bachelors' degree courses at university. Students should contact the Careers Advisor if they are unsure about any tertiary requirements. Students who have achieved NCEA Level Two in Year 12 are entered for the NCEA Level Three qualification. To gain NCEA Level Three, students must gain 80 credits at the Achieved level or above, 60 of these credits must be at Level Three or above. Students must also have achieved Level One Literacy and Numeracy.

20 credits can come from NCEA Level Two. Credits can be attained via internal assessment or external assessment. External assessments usually occur in November; however, some subjects may submit portfolios of work for external marking.

Students who have not yet achieved NCEA Level One or Two may need to take a combination of NCEA Level One, Level Two and Level Three subjects. Students in this situation should contact their Manutaki (Dean) and the Careers Advisor to help determine the best course options for them. New Zealand Scholarship Award Scholarship is an examination which students can sit in addition to each NCEA Level Three examination. Students will need to study for these examinations in their own time. Scholarships are awarded on a subject-by-subject basis, and financial awards are made to students who pass scholarship examinations. Information about the New Zealand Scholarship Award examinations will be distributed before examination entries are finalised. Students should speak with their subject kaiako (teacher) or Manutaki (Dean) about entries to these examinations.



Dual Enrolment

Dual Enrolment allows students to complete their studies both at school and at a tertiary provider, dividing their time between the two places. This approach provides an opportunity for Year 12/13 students to experience a tertiary course aligned with a vocational pathway that interests them, while still being enrolled at school. Students who are interested in this opportunity will go through a selection process and need to be self-managing and motivate to succeed.

Successful applicants would study part-time at Hillmorton High School and part-time at a tertiary provider: Ara, Te Pūkenga, or the National Trade Academy (NTA). They attend Hillmorton 3 or 4 days of each week (Monday to Wednesday/Thursday), and their dual enrolment course for 1 or 2 days each week (Thursday and Friday, or just Friday). Dual Enrolment students are expected to study five subjects at Hillmorton High School on the days they attend school. Applicants will be interviewed by their Manutaki (Dean) or the Careers Advisor who need to approve their choice of course before an application is completed and a contract signed by the student, whanau and school. The final decision about a dual enrolment application is made by the school and the tertiary provider.

Students' results from their dual enrolment course count towards NCEA Level 2 or 3. On completion of their course, it is expected that a student would move on to full-time tertiary study, an apprenticeship or employment.

Applications for Dual Enrolment close early in Term Three, so anyone interested in selection for this programme in 2026 should express interest to their Manutaki or the Careers Advisor as soon as possible.

Student results from HHS, Ara or NTA count towards Level 2
NCEA. On completion of this course students would continue to attend full time tertiary study, apprenticeship or employment.

Course Selection 2026

Each student will receive an individual WebCode so they can make their course selection via a specific website. These WebCodes will be sent out by email in Term 3, Week 3. If you lose or misplace your WebCode, please contact Mrs Casper via email (ladkins@hillmorton.school.nz).

Course selection closes after 4 weeks. During Weeks 3-6 in Term 3, students can change their selections as much as they like. After this date, students cannot make changes and will need to see their Manutaki (Dean) or the Careers Advisor.

Selecting your subjects

When deciding on which subjects to choose, it's important to consider a few key factors:

Interest and Strengths:

Choose subjects that genuinely interest you and that you have a natural inclination or talent for. Enjoying your subjects increases your chances of doing well academically. If you're unsure about a subject, try to gain some exposure by talking to teachers who can provide insights.

Future Goals:

Consider your career aspirations or future plans. Certain careers or higher education paths have specific subject requirements. For instance, if you're aiming for a career in engineering, subjects like Mathematics and Physics would be crucial. If you're interested in pursuing medicine, subjects such as Biology and Chemistry would be beneficial.

Exploring Options:

If you're uncertain about your future career path, it's advisable to keep your subject choices broad initially. This approach allows you to explore different fields and keep more options open for future decisions. Schools often provide opportunities to sample different subjects, especially in earlier years, which can help you make informed choices.

Consultation:

Take advantage of guidance from your teachers, our Careers Advisor Mr Nixon, your whānau, your Manutaki, your Whānau Group Kaiako, Guidance Counsellors, and the Head of Learning Areas and Departments (on the front page) who can provide advice based on your strengths, interests, and career goals. They can offer valuable insights into how different subjects align with various career paths and can help you navigate your decision-making process.

Practical Considerations:

Be mindful of any practical considerations such as prerequisites for future courses or specific skills needed for certain professions. Checking university entrance requirements or career expectations can guide you in selecting subjects that align with these criteria.

Course Entry Requirements:

Please ensure that you meet (or expect to meet) the entry requirements for the courses you have selected. If you do not meet these entry requirements, contact the Teacher in Charge of the course. You must have either written or email permission from the Teacher in Charge if you do not meet the entry requirements.

In summary, choosing subjects should be a balance between what you enjoy and excel in, and what aligns with your future goals or career aspirations. Keeping an open mind early on allows for exploration, while seeking guidance from educators and mentors can provide clarity and direction in making informed choices.

Understanding University Entrance and NCEA

It is possible for students to achieve recognition for achievement at Merit or Excellence in two ways:

Course Endorsements

A student must achieve at least fourteen credits in a subject in one year. Those credits must include at least three from an internal assessment and three from an external assessment. To pass the subject (Achieved), a student needs a total of at least fourteen credits.

To earn a Merit endorsement, all 14 credits must be at Merit or Excellence level.

To earn an Excellence endorsement, all fourteen credits must be at Excellence level.

Subjects without external examinations cannot gain course endorsements. If you are unsure, please contact the Teacher in Charge.

NCEA Certificate Endorsement

A student can achieve their NCEA certificate with a Merit or Excellence endorsement.

To achieve a Level Certificate endorsed with Merit, a student needs a total of at least 50 credits at Merit level or higher (in that level).

To achieve a certificate with Excellence, students must have achieved 50 credits at Excellence level (in that level).

University Entrance

To gain University Entrance (UE), students will need the following:

- Achievement of NCEA Level Three (60 credits at Level Three or higher, 20 credits at Level Two or higher, and achieved NCEA Level One Numeracy and Literacy).
- Fourteen credits in each of three subjects from the list of UE approved subjects.
- The remaining credits to achieve NCEA Level Three may come from either achievement or unit standards.
- UE numeracy 10 credits at Level One or higher from specified achievement standards or the Numeracy Common Assessment Activity.
- UE literacy 10 credits (five in reading and five in writing) from specific Level Two and higher achievement standards, or specific Te Reo Māori and Te Reo Rangatira Level Two standards.

University Entrance requirements are the minimum requirement for entry to university study. Many universities or specific universities have additional requirements. Students should check these at the Careers Centre.

Subject Related Costs

There are some costs that students and their families are responsible for at school:

Personal Stationery: Students are responsible for purchasing their own personal stationery (the specific subject and year-level requirements are listed on the school website).

Educational Support Resources: Teachers may suggest additional educational resources like workbooks or online subscriptions. While optional, whānau can choose to purchase these resources if they find them beneficial.

"Take Home" Components: Costs associated with practical subjects (eg: Technology, Art) where students create tangible projects are charged to whānau. These costs are for materials that students will keep.

Curriculum-Related Activities: Overnight trips and activities that extend learning beyond the classroom may incur costs. Financial support options may be available - students should speak with the subject teacher or their Head of Year.

Preparing for Tertiary Study and Employment

The following programmes can help this process.

Careers Centre

Career Interviews: All Year 13 students participate in at least two scheduled career interviews. This ensures individualised attention and guidance tailored to each student's career aspirations and plans.

Ongoing Support: Students are encouraged to reach out with any questions they have about career planning at any time to help them navigate uncertainties and make informed decisions.

Taster Courses and Experiences: The Careers Centre organises various taster courses and experiences, including visits to Te Pūkenga (polytechnics) and universities. These opportunities expose students to different career paths and educational options, helping them explore and solidify their career ideas.

Weekly Careers Meetings: Attendance at weekly Careers Meetings is mandatory for Year 13 students. These meetings provide a platform for students to interact with representatives from universities, polytechnics, industries, and government agencies. This exposure helps students gather first-hand information and insights relevant to their career interests.

Tertiary Enrolment Guidance: For students planning to pursue tertiary education after school, the school supports them through the enrolment process. This guidance ensures that students understand the requirements and procedures involved in applying to universities or polytechnics.

CV Preparation: Students are expected to create a CV before leaving school. The school offers assistance to students who

need help in drafting their CVs, ensuring they are wellprepared for job applications or further studies.

Annual Careers Expo: All Year 13 students are taken to the annual Careers Expo. This event showcases a wide range of career opportunities, educational institutions, and industry representatives, providing students with valuable networking opportunities and further insights into potential career paths.

STAR Courses

STAR courses are provided by outside agencies including Te Pūkenga/polytechnics, universities and private providers and enable students to gain NCEA credits by participating in experiences relevant to their career plan. There is no cost to students. STAR courses are administered by Ms Agnew in the Careers Centre.

Gateway Programme (Level Two and Three)


The Gateway programme provides an opportunity for students to explore their career ideas through weekly workplace experiences, while continuing their high school education. As with STAR courses, there is no cost to the student. The Gateway programme is administered by Mrs Stanley in the Careers Centre.


Dual Enrolment

Dual Enrolment is an opportunity available to some Year 12 and 13 students. It involves attending a course at a tertiary provider (usually Ara/Te Pūkenga) for one or two days each week throughout the year and attending Hillmorton High School for the other three/four days. See the section on Dual Enrolment in this Course Book or talk to your Manutaki.

Liaison Visits

Many tertiary institutions visit the school and hold seminars on the courses they offer. Many of these occur during the Year 13 Meeting time. However, keep an eye on the school notices for any information.

experiments. Ākonga will build a solid foundation of skills and knowledge essential for further science learning.

10SCI - Year 10 Science

Course Cost: \$0

Teacher in Charge: Mr Fernandes

Compulsory Course

Kaupapa/Content: This course, through a blend of experiments and theory, helps students learn about themselves and the world around them while laying the foundation for further science learning.

- Earth Systems: Explore the different spheres on the Earth and how they are interconnected.
- Human Body Systems: Build an understanding of body systems, supported by organ dissections.
- Forces and Motion: Dive into the physics concepts of forces and motion.
- Electricity: Build electrical circuits and learn the basics of static electricity and current.
- Chemical Reactions: Study chemical reactions, formulae, and equations.
- Plant Biology: Investigate the parts, processes, and life cycles of plants.

1SCE - Level One Science - Externals

Kaupapa/Content: This course covers key science concepts and serves as a stepping stone to Level Two Sciences. It is ideal for ākonga planning careers in Engineering, Health Sciences, and Architecture, to prepare them for advanced studies in various science-related fields.

- Physics in Everyday Life: Use investigations to explore the physics of physical phenomena.
- Genetics: Understand genetic variation, inheritance and how genetic information can be tracked through generations.

1SCI - Level One Science - Internals

Teacher in Charge: Mr Tucker

Kaupapa/Content: This course develops an understanding of science and its application to the real world.

- Microorganisms: Research how microorganisms help or harm humans.
- Scientific Investigation: Conduct scientific investigations in a context.
- Chemical Reactions: Investigate several chemical reactions in context.

This course is assessed through three internal assessments, all based on real world contexts. Through these activities, students will gain practical knowledge and skills, preparing them to be able to draw accurate conclusions through a wide range of contexts and questions.

2AST - Level Two Astronomy

Level Two NCEA

Course Cost: \$180 (Overnight Camp)

Internal Credits: 12 External Credits: 4

Teacher in Charge: Mr Fernandes

Entry Requirements: 10 Credits in L1 Science

Kaupapa/Content: This course is designed for akonga who wish to pursue Science at Level Two but are not necessarily interested in the traditional options of Physics, Biology, or Chemistry. It also provides an introduction to astronomical learning with a qualitative focus for those interested in Space.

- Space Science Investigation: Investigate aspects of astronomy such as impact craters by conducting a scientific investigation.
- Life on Mars: Explore the validity of information presented to the public about life on Mars.
- Life on Mars possible? : Examine the requirements for sustaining life on Mars.
- Stars and Planetary Systems: Study the formation of planetary systems and the life cycles of stars.

2BIO - Level Two Biology

Year 12

Course Cost: \$200 (Overnight Camp + voluntary workbook)

Internal Credits: 11 **External Credits: 8**

Teacher in Charge: Mr Tucker

Entry Requirements: 10 credits in Level 1 Science, including

either: microbes or genetics.

Kaupapa/Content: This course develops students' understanding of life processes. Students will examine animal and plant cells, through practical experiments and microscopy Students will gain a comprehensive understanding of biological systems across different scales, from molecular mechanisms to ecological dynamics and genetic diversity.

- Microscopes: Build practical skills, preparing, sketching and describing microscopic organisms.
- Ecological investigation: An investigation based on rocky shore organisms from Wainui bay (Camp)
- Osmosis investigation: An investigation observing the movement of water across cell membranes

- Cells External: Learning about life processes at the cellular level including cell structures, cell transport and enzymes.
- Genetics External: Learning about genetic variation, inheritance, and change over time.

2CHE - Level Two Chemistry

Level Two NCEA

Course Cost: \$25 (voluntary workbook)

Internal Credits: 10 External Credits: 9

Teacher in Charge: Mr Fernandes

Entry Requirements: 11 credits in Level 1 Science (must include CB1.2: Chemical Reactions) and Math & Stats 1.4

(Demonstrate mathematical Reasoning).

Kaupapa/Content: This Chemistry course develops students' understanding of the nature and behaviour of matter and key concepts in chemistry, preparing them for advanced studies.

- Qualitative and Quantitative Analysis: Build knowledge through practical learning and assessments.
- Structure of Matter: Discover the structure of matter and chemical bonding.
- Organic Compounds: Learn the importance of organic compounds and their interconversions.
- Oxidation-Reduction Reactions: Explore oxidationreduction reactions and learn to identify them in the world.

2LSC - Level Two Life Science

Kaupapa/Content: Students will explore how plants and animals adapt to their environments, the microscopic features of life, and the ways in which human activity has affected different ecosystems. Ākonga who select Level 2 Physics, Chemistry or Biology cannot take this course.

2PSY - Level Two Psychology

Level Two NCEA
Course Cost: \$0
Internal Credits: 16
External Credits: 0

Teacher in Charge: Mr Fernandes

Entry Requirements: 10 credits in Level 1 Science and 10

credits in Level 1 English.

Kaupapa/Content: This psychology course offers an introduction to the field of Psychology, to build an understanding of psychological theory and research methods and equip students with theoretical knowledge and practical skills to evaluate and understand complex human behaviours from psychological viewpoints.

- Psychological approaches: Students will analyse different approaches and use theories to explain addiction to substances like methamphetamine, cocaine, and alcohol, and explore how the explanations of behaviour have developed and changed over time.

- Research: Students will undertake psychological research, conducting an investigation into how the brain processes information, and gaining insights into cognitive mechanisms.



- Use online maps, preparing students for a wide range of geography related careers and study

1HIS - Level One History

Level One NCEA
Course Cost: \$0
Internal Credits: 10
External Credits: 10

Teacher in Charge: Mr Dann

Kaupapa/Content: This history course explores whakapapa, local history, protest, equality, segregation, and conflict.

- Ākonga (students) will construct their family tree using primary sources
- investigate significant aspects and perspectives of the Dawn Raids in Aotearoa and Civil Rights in the USA, and engage with various historical perspectives.
- The course involves asking investigative questions, following a research process, and evaluating sources for reliability and usefulness.

Additionally, ākonga will explore the significance of historical places, people, and events, and understand the exercise of mana and power in the past and its impact on people.

1SST - Level One Social Studies

Level One NCEA
Course Cost: \$0
Internal Credits: 10
External Credits: 5

Teacher in Charge: Ms Coulbeck

Kaupapa/Content: This course has at its centre a focus on people — who they are, what they do, how they change, and what happens to them.

- Enrolment and completion of Pathways Awarua digital platform modules will enhance reading, writing and listening skills so that the NCEA Level One corequisites are attainable.

All work is assessed using NCEA Unit Standards.

- They will also enhance their employability skills through group work in some of the Unit Standards.
- As an individual, they will discover their preferred learning style and link that style to study techniques.
- The entire course challenges their time management skills and those skills are strengthened by application to all tasks. Ākonga are asked to enrol in a STAR short course to help extend their vocational learning.
