

Effort and Attitude Updates

These are completed every three weeks

Effort updates do not link to academic progress/scores, simply the effort and attitude your child exhibits during the day and only in class time. Below is a table of examples that show definitions of each effort and attitude score.

Please remember these are some examples, it does not mean your child is displaying all of these definitions.

Effort Score	Definition and Description
Effort/Attitude score 1	<p>Disengaged</p> <p>This could look like.....</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Walks out of class• Does not complete any tasks set by the teacher• Distracts others from learning• Disrupts the whole classroom• Requires a lot of teachers and learning support intervention to begin learning.
Effort/Attitude score 2	<p>Passive</p> <p>This could look like.....</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Not always focused• Passive in the class• Attempts to act on feedback• Needs several reminders during the day to stay on task or follow instructions• May distract others• Requires supervision to complete tasks
Effort/Attitude score 3	<p>Engaged</p> <p>This could look like.....</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Shows good application• Finds solutions to problems• Listens carefully• Answers questions• Connects ideas• Takes action from feedback• Does need small reminders to stay on task
Effort/Attitude score 4	<p>Highly Motivated</p> <p>This could look like.....</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Excellent focus• Seeks challenges• Asks questions to seek understanding• Responds well to praise and feedback• Organise time effectively• Starts work readily• Stays on task• Exhibits the FIRE values• Learns from setbacks
