Hukanui Whanau Update for 2024

What did ERO recommend for 2025-27?

- 1. <u>Further</u> strengthen schoolwide collection and use of student progress and achievement data to continue to respond effectively to students' learning needs
- 2. <u>Continue</u> to strengthen the integration of Te reo Māori in student learning experiences
- 3. Increase rates of regular student attendance particularly for Māori.

What's our data telling us? Term 3 2024 Whole school Data

90% of all Māori are AT or Above Curriculum expectation in Reading Term 3 2024 Whole school Data

89% of all Māori are AT or Above Curriculum expectation in Writing Term 3 2024 Whole school Data

91% of all Māori are AT or Above Curriculum expectation in Math *Note this is a 1-2% disparity in Reading and Math. Māori are 1% higher than the average in writing.

The Hukanui challenge:

25% of Māori attending more than 70% up to 80%, missing two to three days a fortnight. 6-9 weeks per year.

Community Survey Analysis 2024

Here are the top five common themes from the survey responses about Hukanui School:

Overall Satisfaction and Positive Environment

Summary: Many responses reflect a high level of overall satisfaction with the school. Respondents often describe the school as great, wonderful, and ideal for their children. They appreciate the positive environment and the fact that their children love attending the school.

Examples:

- •"We're really happy with the school, and our kids love it."
- •"It's a great school!"
- •"A great school. Highly recommend."

2. Quality of Teachers and Staff

Summary: The quality of the teaching staff is frequently highlighted as a major strength of the school. Parents commend the teachers for being dedicated, approachable, and effective in meeting students' individual needs. The principal is also praised for being involved and passionate.

Examples:

- •"We love the school, all the teachers are lovely and the principal is very involved and passionate."
- •"Wonderful inclusive community, incredible teachers and principal who know the needs of their students."
- •"Excellent school, well resourced, not had issues with bullying. Approachable teachers who really connect with the kids."

3. Inclusive and Supportive Community

Summary: The school's inclusive and supportive community is frequently mentioned. Parents value the sense of belonging and the supportive atmosphere that caters to diverse student needs and backgrounds.

Examples:

- •"Incredibly supportive of both of my children's individual learning needs. A community, not just a school."
- •"Wonderful supportive and inclusive community with teachers who genuinely care about your child."
- •"A school connected to the community, providing a safe and fun place for learning."

4. Academic Excellence and Opportunities

Summary: Many responses emphasize the school's strong academic focus and the range of opportunities available to students. Parents appreciate the emphasis on core subjects like literacy and numeracy, as well as the wide array of electives and extracurricular activities.

Examples:

- •"It's a good school. I'm really happy with the literacy and numeracy programmes and my child is thriving there."
- •"Highly recommend. Hukanui provides a great environment for our kids with its values, good structure, great communication, amazing staff, and a sense of belonging nurturing the community."
- •"Ideal school in terms of curriculum, diversity, sports."

5. Strong Reputation and Positive Recommendations

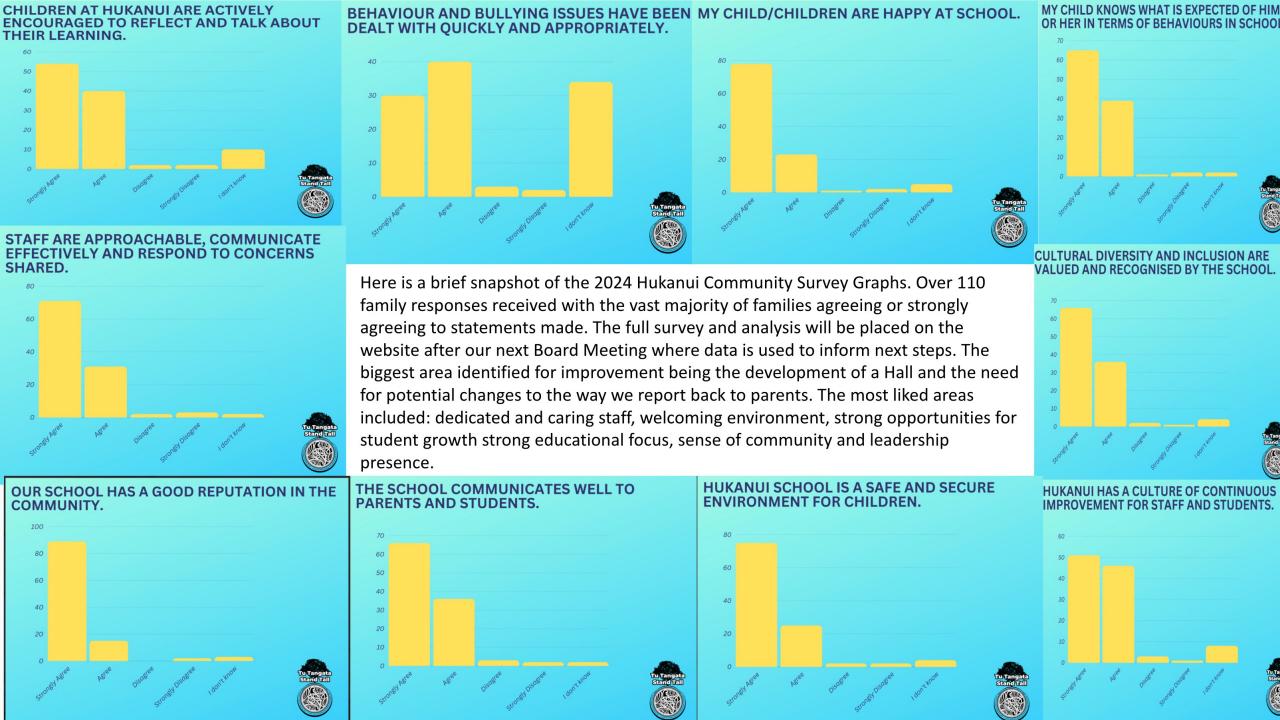
Summary: The school's strong reputation and positive recommendations from parents are recurring themes. Many respondents describe Hukanui as highly recommended and the best primary school, reflecting strong confidence in its quality and effectiveness.

Examples:

- •"The best primary school in Hamilton."
- •"No primary school better than Hukanui, highly recommended."
- •"A great school. Highly recommend."
- •"Great school, lead by the front via the principal who brings a superb, friendly and engaging energy, hope for the communities sake he stays on until retirement"

 These themes highlight the school's strengths in creating a positive environment,

maintaining high-quality staff, fostering an inclusive community, delivering strong academic outcomes, and having a reputable standing in the community.

Attendance Matters

- Students who attend school regularly achieve higher scores than students who don't attend
- Regular attendance and punctuality are important life skills
- By 6th grade, chronic absence becomes a leading indicator that a student will drop out of high school
- Missing just 2 days a month means a child misses 10%
 of the school year

"School attendance is the most crucial prerequisite for quality education students cannot learn if they are not at school."

This year the percentage of students regularly attending all NZ schools in Term 2, 2023 was only...

Up 7.2% on the same term last year, a record low 39.8%. Term 1 was 59.5%

Regular attendance is defined as attending greater than 90% of class time or missing no more than one day each fortnight.
