Learning is designed to spark interest

The afternoon programme includes broader curriculum options. Social Sciences, Physical Education/Health, Languages and the Arts are taught using a mix of teacher-directed, guided and self-directed learning.

There are further opportunities for children to extend themselves and to lead their own learning - striving for Values badges, BEST badges, and Mathematics & Science badges.

All students are supported to utilise Breens online learning hubs and access appropriate digital tools to enhance their learning.
