The phones are charged and have the school's phone number on them. Teachers take a first aid kit to treat minor injuries. Students are informed of the rules for safe walking before leaving school: stay with the group, walk on the footpath, stay with your buddy when walking along the roadside, and be aware of driveways. One adult is at the front with a fluro vest, and one is at the back. The other adults are interspersed throughout the group.	Cell phone Class Roll Fluoro vest First aid kit
Vehicles on busy roads: hit by a car Trip while walking	Moderate Low	Cross the road at the lights on Sawyers Arms Road. If someone gets hit by a car, the teacher in charge contacts the emergency services and the school. Two adults stay with the injured while the other adults walk the rest of the children to a safe space: this can be Papanui Domain, a parking space on Sawyers Arms, Papanui High School grounds, or St Joseph's school. The teacher at the front checks the footpath, removing hazards as they go. A teacher will check the walkway is open on the morning of the trip.	



		The school is responsible for contacting the parents of the injured child.
