

Uniform Code

The tidy wearing of correct uniform, or respecting the Year 13 Dress Code, are conditions of attendance at Hillmorton High School.

Uniform Expectations

Full correct uniform is to be worn to, from, and at school, when students are identifiable as Hillmorton High School students in a public place or at a function where the wearing of school uniform is required.

If a student is unable to wear a full correct uniform, a note from parents/caregivers must be received by their Manutaki. Where possible, the school will supply uniform items. Generally, the school will supply uniform items on a short-term basis if necessary. A temporary uniform permit may be available.

Non-uniform items may be confiscated by staff, and be returned to parents/caregivers by negotiation.

Black Socks only.

Hats are plain navy and are not to be worn inside.

Sports uniform is for sports teams only and is not to be worn during the ordinary school day.

Non-regulation shirts/blouses are not permissible. Any garments worn under the white blouse/shirt should not be visible with the exception of a white t-shirt or white thermal, which may only show at the neckline.

All uniform items should be clearly and securely named with the owner's name and initials.

Hair should be clean, well-groomed, clear of the face, and tied back if necessary. While a navy or dark coloured hair tie is preferable, any hair tie worn should be appropriate for school.

Jewellery

Some jewellery can be worn with the uniform:

Small, discreet and appropriate earrings (maximum of two per ear).

One small, discreet nose stud. It needs to be removed when safety is of concern e.g. sporting activities

A single-strand, discreet, fine chain necklace.

Approved taonga or approved items of religious or spiritual significance, worn around the neck. One approved Whānau House wrist-band.

Objects, including studs and rings, are not allowed in externally visible body piercings. This includes nose, lips, chin and eyebrow studs or rings, which are considered inappropriate in the school environment at any time (see above for earring and nose stud information).

Makeup

In Years 7-11, no eye makeup, lipstick or nail polish can be worn. In Years 12 and 13, makeup that is light, discreet and appropriate for the work environment may be worn.

The school reserves the right to determine whether a student's general appearance is unacceptable and not in compliance with the school uniform and dress codes.

Year 13

Year 13 students are not required to wear the school uniform, however, they can if they wish to. This practice seeks to recognise the transition to the work/study world.

At this level, the school respects individual differences and taste but Year 13 students need to be mindful of the leadership role they have in the wider school.

Student dress must be appropriate for a work or school environment, and clean and tidy. The following are not considered suitable: singlets, inappropriate messages and slogans on any garments, ripped or holed clothing, brief or skimpy clothing (adequate coverage is expected).

Footwear must be worn at all times. Jandals are not acceptable footwear. For health and safety reasons, covered footwear is required in specialist classrooms.

Hats are not to be worn inside.

Jewellery is acceptable if it is discreet and appropriate for a more formal work environment.

Body piercing which is externally visible is considered inappropriate in the school environment. Lip, chin and eyebrow rings/studs are not to be worn. One small discreet nose stud is acceptable, however, it needs to be removed when safety is of concern e.g. sporting activities.

Hair should be clean, well-groomed, clear of the face, and tied back if necessary.

Facial hair is allowed but must be clean, groomed and tidy. It is permitted on the face only and must not extend onto the neck.

Students may wear makeup if it is light, discreet and appropriate for a work environment.

Students unable to meet these dress code requirements have the alternative of wearing school uniform.

All Year Levels



- White short-sleeved shirt or blouse with Hillmorton logo
- White polo style knit top (short-sleeved) with Hillmorton logo
- White long-sleeved shirt (open neck or with tie) no logo
- Kilt
- Black trousers
- Navy skirt
- Navy shorts
- Pullover sweatshirt

- Jacket
- Black crew socks
- Black knee-length socks or tights
- Plain black, closed-toe, with non-visible logo shoes.

ACCESSORIES (optional)

The following items may also be worn:

- Sun hat/Bucket hat/Cap/Beanie
Plain black or navy
- Scarf - school design only
- Tie - school design only

PE uniform

- Top - regulation t-shirt (as pictured)
- Shorts - regulation navy PE shorts (as pictured)
- Trackpants - regulation navy PE trackpants

Senior Uniform

Year 11 and above (optional).



- Senior blazer with the blouse or senior shirt.
- Senior vest with the blouse or senior shirt.
- Shirts should be tucked in.
