Digital Technology	Digital technology remains a focus for our kura as we aim to provide our ākonga with a range of opportunities to create, share ideas and explore the world. Digiclub will continue for those interested in pursuing their digital skills in depth the chance to do so. Literacy and Maths	Our literacy covers reading and writing and is integrated into all subjects where possible. We encourage daily reading at home to complement what we do at school. Students will be reading from online sites, School Journals, and age-appropriate reading books. They will be required to read from a book every day, this can be from either the library or brought in from home. We also engage in a variety of writing each day, this is closely tied to both our terms inquiry and English language rules explicitly taught through our spelling programme. This term we will be focusing on both narrative and poetry writing. In maths this term we will revisit our number knowledge and explore the concepts of time and temperature.	
Y7/8 Technology	All Tōtara students are involved in weekly Technology at Christchurch East School on Monday afternoons throughout the year. Learning contexts for 2023 include creative design (fabric and metal) and food technology. Our Year 6 cohort will have the opportunity to explore these workshops in preparation for next year on 11th December.
