Term 3 celebration!





Maths

Maths this term will be linked to Enterprise as well. We will be recognising, identifying, comparing and using New Zealand notes and coins to make totals. As well as Roleplaying shopping, using shopping lists and using play money. The Koru children will be devising and using problem solving strategies to explore situations mathematically. This is also a perfect chance to conduct a statistical investigation and make a display of the data collected, make statements about a data display and justify these ideas.
