Hello Parents/Caregivers and Whanau

Tena koutou katoa. Ngā mihi nui ki a koutou katoa. As-salamu alaykum. Hola. Talofa. Kon'nichiwa. Kamusta. Nĭ hău. Namastee. Magandang hapon.

It has been a great first term of the year, free of disruptions and full of learning opportunities for our tamariki – children. There have been a number of highlights: the Year 7-8 camp at Hanmer Springs, Beach Education for Years 1-4, The Safe Decibels Programme for Years 5-6, the Junior Triathlon, Year 7-8 sailing, kayaking for the prefects, free swimming lessons for Years 3-6 and our swimming sports and celebrations.

Our new Kapa Haka tutors, Matua Sonny and Tuahine Tui, have been doing a great job focusing on learning new waiata, the origins of waiata and their meaning, tikanga Māori, and refining our haka. The Gymnastics group has been training hard with Mrs Inwood, Yolande has done some amazing work with our choir, and Jane has been training our Literacy team who entered the Te Koru Literacy Quiz this week. Julie and David Winton have continued to work on their passion - our tamariki gardens with children.

Our teachers have been hard at work providing all kinds of learning programmes for children across the school, both in their classes and extra-curricula activities. Our whole team at Belfast, teachers, teacher aides and administration staff, along with Mr Aldersley, who is taking care of our grounds and buildings, have made Term 1 a very successful time for all our children.

Supporting us in our daily work are other professionals from the Ministry of Education, Paige (Mana Ake), Paula (school counsellor) and many volunteers. We are very grateful for the contribution they have made, and of course, thanks to the many parents who have supported our activities as volunteers, providing supervision and transport. Kia mau te wehi - great effort team!

Junior Block Remediation Work

The work on the Junior Block will continue into Term 2. As well as remediating weather tightness problems, the Ministry of Education is also funding upgrades to the acoustics, lighting and ventilation of the building. The anticipated completion date is mid-June. Moving classes back into the Junior Block will take place at the end of Term 2, a few weeks later, to avoid disruption to learning programmes.

Gold Awhi

This term we were able to present our first Gold Awhi Badge to Zara Johnstone. To reach this very high standard Zara earned 1200 Awhis. Zara, one of our two Head Students, has taken on many extra responsibilities and through this has earned this amazing number of Awhis. We are really proud of her for reaching this high level of achievement.

Many other children have reached the Bronze level with certificates for the Year 1-4s and Badges for the Years 5-8. "Pizza with the Principal" has happened three times during the term for all the children who have reached 300 Awhis at either the Bronze or Silver level. This seems to be one of the most favourite awards.

A final project for the gardens is nearing completion with groups of senior students designing and painting pou (poles) that will be erected to bring some colour and more interest to the area. 

A petition will also be circulating on uniform nights and at Club Day.

Submission text for copying and pasting:

I'm submitting on the draft Long Term Plan to ask the Council to prioritise the immediate renewal of the Belfast netball courts at Sheldon Park and the repair of the toilet block.

The courts are in terrible state and in dire need of renewal. The netball courts are a health and safety concern because:

- they flood when it rains
- they are slippery with ice on frosty mornings
- when most teams train in the evenings they are slippery and damp from night-time dew
- part of one court is permanently wet and covered in a slick film because it never dries out
- they have extensive cracking filled with vegetation
- they have holes for tennis net poles that are no longer used

The toilet block was damaged in the earthquakes and is frankly, in a disgusting state.

The junior teams at the Belfast Netball Club, Belfast School, Belfast Kids First Kindergarten and other community and sporting groups use the courts. The senior teams (under 17 and up) no longer use the courts due to the high risk of injury. Instead the Club pays each year to hire courts for senior teams to train on. This is a large burden. Belfast Netball Club is a large community based club, run by a small, dedicated committee. It has approximately 250 registered players this year. New subdivisions and the proposed addition of a second school in the area means this number will grow. However, for the Club to be able to support growth it requires adequate facilities, now, not in 2027. Safe courts are essential for the Club's future. Please Christchurch City Council, prioritise the immediate renewal of Belfast Netball Courts and the immediate repair of the toilet block! Bring forward the Community Parks Planned Hard Surfaces Sheldon Park projects works and include the repair of the toilets with it.




