Age Criteria

Any male player born in the years 2002

Registration Criteria

The player must be registered with the NZIHF and their Regional Association in 2017.

Playing Positions

Any combination of forwards and defense. NZIHF has not been granted permission to send a goaltender.

Cost

The NZIHF will pay 50% of each player's flights.
Once at the camp, all meals and activities are paid for by the IIHF.

Supervision

A NZIHF appointed coach will travel with the players to and from camp.
