PARKING

There will be parking restrictions near Forsyth Barr Stadium from 2pm and offending vehicles will be towed from the event area. Please check on-street signs before parking your vehicle. Traffic will be heavy, so the closer you park to the Stadium, the longer it will take you to leave the area after the concert.

WALKING

PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Free shuttle buses for people with concert ticket will run from outside the Dunedin Public Library on Moray Place every 5 minutes from 6pm to 7pm.

A limited number of free shuttle buses will return to the Octagon from Harbour Terrace immediately after the concert.

To help residents and visitors get home later in the evening, the DCC is running several buses from the Central City Bus Hub in Great King Street between 12am and 1.30am. The buses will travel on three routes – South Dunedin, North Dunedin (via Highgate) and Mosgiel.

The cost is a gold coin donation.

STADIUM INFORMATION

Gates open at 6pm. Check your ticket to make sure you go to the correct gate. You can bring:

- ✓ Clear sealed bottles of water up to one litre – note that lids will be removed from water bottles at the gates
- ✓ Special food for dietary requirements
- ✓ Homemade food like sandwiches
- ✓ Baby foods and liquids
- ✗ No BYO takeaway meals or alcohol is allowed
- ✗ No glass allowed – this includes glass perfume bottles
- ✗ Personal cameras may be permitted, but must not have a removable lens.

There will be bag searches and wandering, as well as intoxication assessments when you arrive at the Stadium. Have a good night but take it easy – you don't want to miss the entertainment.
